Aim of The Course:

Dear Students,

Today, English has become the major international language in almost all fields. The main objective of this course is to improve much needed English reading, writing, listening and speaking skills of IR students as well as to develop their IR terminology knowledge at the same time. In this course, we will study the basic ideas and concepts of International Relations through lectures and listening and speaking and other activities. We will also learn the English vocabulary related with IR. The goals of this course are as follows:

- 1) Having a good understanding of current issues of International Relations.
- 2) Learning English technical terms and their usage in this field.
- 3) Acquiring basic skills of expressing each students' own view on various International Relations subjects through discussions.
- 4) Developing students' own interests in chosen topics.

Course Outcomes:

This course aims to improve all language skills but especially two areas are of focus: Reading and writing. Students who complete this course should be able to better understand IR related texts in their courses, familiarize with IR terminology and also be able to better express themselves in their writings.

Method:

In the classroom, each week, the instructor will give students specific texts related to IR and ask them to use the target vocabulary of that specific chapter to fill in the missing parts of the texts while also carrying out reading and comprehension practices. Later the students will discuss the text and will express their opinion on the subject. Finally, written questions will be asked about the text and the students will be asked to give written replies in form of short essays through weekly homework.
